Harvest Festival 2023

We are really looking forward to joining together this year to celebrate Harvest. This year's celebration will take place on Wednesday 11th October in the school hall. To ensure that we can accommodate all of the children's parents, there will be two assemblies as follows.

Behaviour in School

We aim to provide challenging, stimulating and fun educational experiences in school and as you know, we have very high expectations of our children.

We celebrate and value the children's excellent work through the use of prescriptive praise, positive comments, displaying their good work, celebrating together in our weekly Star of the Week assembly and awarding stickers, rewards or merits in class and around school. This ensures our children are well motivated to learn and in turn contribute to the high standards of behaviour we expect.



Unfortunately, children by their nature do on occasion make the wrong behaviour choice; we aim to support these children to learn from their mistakes and make better choices in the future. We are an inclusive school and this means that we have a wide range of different children in our school, all with varying needs- at times some children may need a little bit more support than others. If you have any concerns or questions about how we support children's behaviour in school, please do come and ask.

Swimming

As you know, swimming is part of the national curriculum. In particular, pupils should be taught to:

- swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres
- use a range of strokes effectively [for example, front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke]
- perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations

In previous years, children in Year 3 and Year 4 at Hill Top would swim for a block in the Autumn Term, however due to increasing costs and high numbers of non-payers this is no longer sustainable for school. We place high importance on teaching swimming skills so we are going to instead prioritise swimming for non-swimmers in upper Key Stage 2 to ensure that they meet the expectations of the national curriculum in Key Stage.

As you will be aware, from time to time some of our younger children may have an 'accident' at school and need to change their clothes. *Please if you have any of the school's spare clothes at home can you wash them and return them to school?* I purchased new pants and socks at the start of the year and they have not been returned to school so we now have a very limited supply.

Parking Concerns

As you already know, Beaumont Avenue is very congested at the end of the day when parents are collecting their children. We all want to keep our children safe, so here are some top tips on how you can make a difference.

How Can You Help?

- ✓ Keep your speed down
- ✓ Turn your engine off if leaving your vehicle
- ✓ Leave enough room for other road users to easily pass through
- Make sure your child leaves and enters your vehicle safely onto the pavement
- ✓ Check for pedestrians and cyclists before opening a car door
- Leave enough room on pavements for pedestrians to get past
- ✓ Take care when reversing

Please Keep Clear...

- ✓ Zig Zags and School Entrances
- ✓ Dropped Kerbs
- ✓ Resident's Driveways

Please park considerately around our school and keep our children safe!

Have you considered...

- Parking further away from school and walking?
- Walking or cycling to school instead? This is a great way to contribute to a child's 60 minutes of activity a day and is easy to incorporate into your daily routine. Try it once a week at first and see how easy it can be.

I know that you all lead very busy lives, but if we all work together it will be much safer for everyone.

Parental Supervision

If you are on site before the doors/gates open in the morning, please can I remind you that you must supervise your children at all times.

Operation Encompass

We are an Operation Encompass School. This is an initiative developed with Leicestershire Police to ensure that school will be informed when a child or young person has been involved or exposed to a domestic abuse incident the previous evening.





The aim of this is to enable the school to sensitively and appropriately support a child to ensure they feel safe and secure after an incident of domestic abuse. Operation Encompass work with the Police Force sharing with us incidents that they have attended where they feel there has been an impact upon a child's physical, emotional or mental well-being. This information is shared in confidence and will help us to support and care for the children at our school even more effectively.
