

Ashby Hill Top Primary School Impact of 2017-2018 Pupil Premium Grant

In 2017-2018 we received £48,180 Pupil Premium Grant. The funding was used in a variety of ways in order to improve pupil attainment and to help to overcome any

barriers to learning.

With this in mind, the 2017-2018 PP allocation was spent as follows:

Provision of wraparound care and school milk- £400

ICT and audio equipment - £200

School residential and day trips - £1,450

Provision of swimming - £120

Specialist Teaching Service support, assessments and accessing the curriculum - £50

HLTA to oversee programmes and run interventions - £21,000

Additional teacher hours for 1:1 support - £12,600

Supply costs for teachers with responsibility for all pupil premium pupils - £3,000

KS2 SATs intervention - £2,000

Lunchtime support - £910

Educational Psychologist - £1,200

Musical instrument - £308

External S & L training and cover costs - £3000

PP children made more progress from Year 2 to Year 6 in Reading and Writing, than Non PP children and slightly less in maths.

Summary of activities on attainment, progress and other aspects of emotional health and well-being

- Additional tuition was great motivation and has contributed to pupil premium pupil's progress
- Pupil feedback was really positive. Additional tuition has seen some pupil progress pupils make accelerated progress
- Pupil premium children have been involved in some form of extra-curricular activity or music provision therefore taking a much greater part in school life with a visible rise in their confidence levels noted
- Continued pastoral support has a positive impact in pupil's social skills and emotional resilience
- Attendance of pupil premium pupils (95.7%) compared to non-pupil premium is very similar and in line with whole school attendance
- Specific LSA support has helped the school identify gaps in learning and address these quickly
- Impact on pupil attitudes questionnaires show an improvement in resilience and resourcefulness
