# EYFS parents (2024 intake) Open Evening

Do you have a child who is due to start school in September 2024? Choosing your child's school is an important decision. This evening is aimed at giving new parents as much information as possible in order to help them make the right decision. Our Open Evening will take place on **Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> October at 6.30pm**.

There will be a short presentation in the hall, followed by a chance to tour our amazing EYFS base and talk informally to staff. We will be advertising this event locally, but if you or someone you know is interested in attending, they can book a place by contacting the school office.

### **Mild Illnesses**

We are aware that the COVID-19 pandemic may have caused some parents to feel less confident when assessing whether your child is well enough to be in school. As we all know, school attendance is vital to the

life chances of children and being in school regularly improves health and wellbeing. We would encourage parents to use the NHS 'ls my child too ill for school?' guidance if you are unsure what to do.



## **Tesco Community Grants**

# **End of day arrangements**

I thought it might be useful to remind everyone of the arrangements for the end of the day. As you will be aware, this is a very busy time with lots of children and adults on the school site. We have a range of procedures in place to keep the children as safe as possible.

To help the children locate their adults we ask that parents try to stand in the same place each day.

Please may we kindly ask you not to stand in the main walkways or around the school gates. It is crucial that these areas have clear visibility. Although we do all that we can to maximise your children's safety please can we remind you that it is your responsibility to arrive on time to collect your child or let the office know if you are running late, so that a member of staff can be responsible for your child until you arrive (remember that there is an after-school club on site daily if needed).

Key Stage 2 children (Years 3 to 6) with parents who are collecting younger siblings will walk to the Key Stage 1 playground to find their adult. If they cannot see you, they should come back to stand by an adult on the gate.

Teachers/support staff are out by the gates/on the playground at the end of the day, please do not heistate to chat to us if you have any questions- or just to introduce yourself!

## Are you entitled to Free School Meals?

Children of families in receipt of certain benefits may be eligible for additional funding – Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) - which we can use to provide free school milk and lunches for your child. Support with paying for school trips and other educational activities can be offered by the SLT for pupils in receipt of this funding – please contact Miss Middleton on <a href="mailto:slt@ashbyhilltop.leics.sch.uk">slt@ashbyhilltop.leics.sch.uk</a> to request this assistance. Even if you don't wish to take advantage of any of these, school can still claim much needed funding for those who are eligible. Under current rules the funding lasts for 6 years, even if your circumstances change in that time. If you have not already applied, or if your circumstances have changed recently, we would encourage you to



check eligibility and apply online. Please contact the school office for more details.

## We got Gold!

We are delighted to announce that we have achieved the School Games Gold Mark Award for the 2022/23 academic year. The School Games Mark is a Government-led award scheme

launched in 2012, facilitated by the Youth Sport Trust to reward schools for their commitment to the

development of competition across their school and into the community, and we are delighted to have been recognised for our success.

We are extremely proud of our children for their dedication to all aspects of school sport, including those young volunteers, leaders and officials who make our competitions possible. As part of our application, we were asked to fulfil criteria in the areas of participation, competition, workforce and clubs, and we are pleased that the hard work of Mrs McMahon and everyone at Ashby Hill Top has been rewarded this year.

### DID YOU KNOW THAT WE OPERATE A VOLUNTARY ONE-WAY SYSTEM ON THE ESTATE?

To ensure the safety of our children during busy drop off and collection times, we ask that our parents and carers follow a voluntary one-way system when entering and exiting the estate.

This one-way system has been used in the past by visitors to the school, but I am aware that many new parents may not know about it and how successful it is in keeping traffic flowing at busy times.

Enter **Beaumont Avenue** and follow the road round, turning right into **Huntingdon Road** then right onto Woodside to exit the estate.

Alternatively, stay on **Beaumont Avenue** and follow the road right round and turn right onto **Woodside** to exit the estate.

We ask that cars do not drive against the suggested flow of traffic and do not turn right into Loudoun Way from Huntington Road.

This system may add a few minutes to your day, but it will ensure that all cars can enter and exit the estate in safety.
