## **Outcomes in Y1 Phonics, KS1 SATs and KS2 SATs**

These are the key measures of success for the school. In this table you can see the comparative data of Pupil Premium pupils achieving Age Related Expectations with pupils who are not receiving this additional funding.

In 2016-17 we received £68,000 pupil premium funding which we spent as follows:

- Provision of wraparound care and school milk £3,200
- School uniform £150

- Specialist Teaching Service support and assessments £800

- LSA to provide additional support for PP children (social communication groups, language development, extra reading and comprehension) £12,000
- Supply costs for teachers with responsibility for all pupil premium pupils £3500
- SATs intervention £3500
- Lunchtime supervisor £2850
- Educational Psychologist £800

## **Outcomes for Pupil Premium children in 2017**

Our statutory results for reading, writing and maths for all of our children have improved. The most significant improvements have been for our children on the Pupil Premium record, for example, the percentage of Year 6 Pupil Premium pupils achieving a pass in reading, writing and maths has risen threefold.

We are aiming to improve upon our 2016/17 results and our target is to continue to meet and exceed ARE for our Pupil Premium children throughout their school life.

In 2017/8 we will receive approximately £70,000 pupil premium funding which we anticipate will be spent to support the following estimated costs:

- To provide supply cover for the teachers with responsibility for all pupil premium children £4000
- Provision of wraparound care £3000
- Costs of residentials, trips, swimming and out of school clubs £2500
- HLTA time £23,000
- Teacher time for additional 1:1 work £10,000
- Specialist Teaching Services £3000
- Resourcing to support intervention and 1:1 work £1000
- Lunchtime supervisor £3000
- Purchase reading intervention £3000
- Targeted interventions and training to address specific areas of need £3000
- EPIC S&L Programme £3000
- The remainder of the allocation has not yet been allocated
